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Fall After-School Theater Classes

3:45-4:35pm - Creative Drama (Ages 7-11)

Students learn while having fun by participating in theater activities, role-playing games, and creative storytelling that ignite imaginations, inspire self-confidence, build leadership skills and develop verbal and non-verbal communication skills.

4:45-5:35pm - Improvisation (Ages 12-16)

Students gain social awareness and develop creativity as they master the basic concepts of improvisation and scene building. Working in improvisation also helps students develop the ability to focus and engage in active listening.

5:45-6:35pm - Acting Through Song (Ages 13-18)

Poise, musicality, and presentation skills increase as students explore techniques for analyzing lyrics and meaning in the context of musicals. Students will be able to act through songs and understand the meaning behind how a song takes you on a journey of self discovery within a character.


