## DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I was in middle school when I first came across TAPE, which perhaps was too early, or perhaps was perfect. The play taught me at that young age that memory is both fallible and malleable. It showed me that a person can be blind to their subliminal wants, yet calculating in their manipulation of others. The play rocked my romantic illusion of heroes and villains. Plus, it was funny—sometimes very funny—despite and even because of its heavy, not-funny subject matter. It took me twenty years before I could articulate it this way, but TAPE taught me that humor comes from discomfort, and that discomfort is an oft necessary component of growth.

While times have certainly changed since TAPE was first performed in 1999—that is, the attitudes around consent and sexual assault have fortunately matured, at least in some circles—it is those aspects of the play which remain as relevant today as they did then that draw me to it: insecurity that masquerades as masculinity, jealousy that embeds itself like a splinter, and the unvarying truth that whoever controls the narrative holds the power.

The talented cast of this production approached the material with intuition and courage, and I am lucky to have worked with them. Likewise, I am grateful to the Chatham Players and to One Weekend Only for entrusting me with a play that I have for so long wanted to direct, and for having faith in you, the audience, that you would take a risk by coming out to see it.

Enjoy the discomfort.

#### STEVE RUSKIN SET DESIGN & FIGHT CHOREOGRAPHER


